DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State

Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, James H. McMenamy,

(hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Discovery Control Plan

Pursuant to Rules 190.1 and 190.2, TEXAS RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE (TRCP), Petitioner intends discovery in this case to be conducted under the Level I Discovery Control Plan.

II.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001. et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

III.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Dallas County, Texas.

<u>James H. McMenamy - Disciplinary Petition</u> Page 1 An officer may serve citation on Respondent's counsel, William Frank McIntyre, 3439 Westminster, Dallas, Texas 75205.

IV.

On or about June 5, 1996, Respondent acted as the closing agent in a multi-party series of real estate transactions for Commonwealth Land & Title Company, (hereinafter referred to as "Commonwealth"). In the capacity of closing agent, and as an attorney receiving funds on behalf of a thirty party, Respondent collected and disbursed funds to the involved parties. Thereafter, Respondent failed to deliver funds to one of the parties, and disbursed \$52,006.11 to a party not entitled to receive those funds. The party receiving the funds in error subsequently ceased operating. Also, Respondent failed to keep the funds separated until an accounting determined what party was to receive what portion of the funds.

V.

Commonwealth did not discover this error until on or about January 28, 1997. Highland Homes, one of the parties, notified Commonwealth that Respondent failed to provide them with \$52,006.11 in sales proceeds. Subsequently, Commonwealth paid Highland Homes the \$52,006.11 and prosecuted Respondent in the 116th District Court of Dallas County, Texas, to recover those funds.

VI.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs IV and V, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rules 1.14(b), and (c) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

VII.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Commonwealth Land & Title Company filing a complaint on April 29, 1998.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
