DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, R. Allen Jones, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Discovery Control Plan

Pursuant to Rules 190.1 and 190.2, TEXAS RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE (TRCP), Petitioner intends discovery in this case to be conducted under the Level II Discovery Control Plan.

II.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

III.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Dallas County,

Texas, his State Bar of Texas Number is 10937300. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his place of business located at 3306 W. Walnut, Suite 502, Garland, Texas 75042.

IV.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

In or about November of 1998, Tracy Hogue ("Hogue") hired Respondent to represent him in a divorce that was anticipated to have been uncontested. At the initial meeting, Hogue paid Respondent \$250.00 of the agreed amount of \$498.00. Hogue's friend, Laura Therrell, notified Respondent that the divorce papers incorrectly stated that Hogue wanted custody of his minor child. Respondent failed to return or respond to Hogue's telephone calls and voice mail messages. Respondent subsequently moved his office without notifying Hogue. Since Respondent was not listed with directory assistance, Hogue had no way of locating him.

V.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs IV, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violate Rules 1.01(b) and 1.03(a) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

VI.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Tracy Hogue filing a complaint on March 5, 1999.

VII.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

On or about January 22, 1999, Tonya Gomez ("Gomez") hired Respondent to handle an annulment. Thereafter, Respondent neglected Gomez's legal matter by failing to finalize the matter. When Gomez attempted to contact Respondent to determine the status of her case, she discovered that Respondent had relocated his office without notifying her. Gomez was required to hire and compenstate other counsel to finalize her matter.

VIII.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraph VII, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rule 1.03(a) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

IX.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Tonya Gomez filing a complaint on March 5, 1999.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to which it is entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
