DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, David E. Davis (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. § 81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992. Pursuant to Rule 190.1, Texas Rules of Civil Procedure (TRCP), Petitioner intends that discovery in this case be conducted under Discovery Control Plan - Level 2, as provided in Rule 190.3, TRCP.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of, and has his principal place of practice in, Wichita County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at 916 9th St., Ste 100, Wichita Falls, Texas, 76301-3428.

In or around February 1993, Respondent was retained by Shirley McAllister to create a trust that would pay her an income from the investment, and preserve the principal for her use at a later date. Respondent advised Ms. McAllister that he could establish such a trust, and that he, acting as trustee, could invest these funds for her at ten percent interest per year. This was agreed upon by Respondent and Ms. McAllister verbally, but was not put into writing. After the sale of Ms. McAllister's home, Complainant endorsed the proceeds from the sale over to Respondent in the amount of thrity five thousand dollars, for the purpose of establishing the trust.

IV.

Since the establishment of the trust, Respondent has refused to supply a copy of the trust documents to Ms. McAllister. Respondent has been delinquent in his payments to Complainant, with some of the latest check payments having been returned for insufficient funds.

V

The conduct described in the two above paragraphs constitutes a violation of Rule(s) 1.08(a)(1)(2) and (3) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, Article X, Section 9, State Bar Rules, effective January 1, 1990.

VI.

The complaint which forms the basis of the cause of action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by a complaint filed by Ms. Shirley McAllister on or about May 19, 1999.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to
