DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, Steven L. Rushing, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Discovery Control Plan

Pursuant to Rules 190.1 and 190.2, TEXAS RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE (TRCP), Petitioner intends discovery in this case to be conducted under the Level II Discovery Control Plan.

II.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

III.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Gregg County, Texas.

IV.

On or about August 17, 1994, Morris Newsome (hereinafter referred to as "Newsome") employed Respondent to represent him in a personal injury case, arising from a one vehicle accident which occurred on July 12, 1994. Thereafter, on July 12, 1996, Respondent filed suit on behalf of Newsome. Respondent had citation issued and one attempt was made at service, but Respondent failed to obtain substituted service. As a result of such failure on the part of Respondent, the statute of limitations ran on Newsome's claim. After Respondent became aware of the fact that limitations had run on Newsome's claim, he volunteered to settle the matter by compensating him.

V.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs IV, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rules 1.01(b)(1), and 1.03(a) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

VIII.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Morris Newsome filing a complaint on or about February 16, 1998.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to
