Respondent, and Respondent failed to respond to Complainant's telephone calls requesting information about the status of her case. After Complainant decided to retain another attorney, Respondent failed to timely return Complainant's file.

The foregoing acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent occurred on or after January 1, 1990, and constitute conduct violative of Rules 1.01(b)(1); 1.03(a) and 1.15(d) of the Texas Rules of Professional Conduct.

IV.

The complaint which forms the basis of the cause of action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by a complaint filed on or about October 5, 1999 by Rosemary Sanchez.

#### PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
