DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, Juan R. Ledesma, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, <u>et seq.</u> (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Hidalgo County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his business address located at 1112 North 23rd Street, McAllen, Hidalgo County, Texas 78501. In and around August, 1992, Avelino Sanchez (hereinafter called "Sanchez") contacted Respondent regarding representation of his wife, Francisca Sanchez, who was incarcerated in Bryan, Texas, after being convicted on federal drug charges. Sanchez wanted Respondent to review his wife's case and determine if her sentence could be reduced. To assist in his evaluation, Sanchez provided Respondent with various documents relating to Francisca Sanchez' conviction. After purportedly reviewing the documents, Respondent indicated to Sanchez that he would take the case, but needed a \$1,500.00 retainer to travel to Bryan and meet with Francisca Sanchez to obtain additional information from her. On or about August 27, 1992, Sanchez paid Respondent the \$1,500.00 retainer fee.

IV.

Respondent thereafter made two (2) appointments to meet with Francisca Sanchez on or about September 14, 1992, and on or about October 8, 1992. However, on each occasion, Respondent failed to appear for the meeting. In addition, Respondent failed to perform any other legal services on Francisca Sanchez' behalf. As a result, Sanchez decided to terminate Respondent's representation, and notified him of the termination by mail on or about November 30, 1992, and on or about December 10, 1992. Sanchez also demanded that Respondent refund the unearned retainer fee Sanchez had previously paid him.

When Respondent failed to respond to his letters and demand for a refund, Sanchez called Respondent's office on or about December 16, 1992, and on or about December 17, 1992. In addition, Sanchez travelled from his home in Fort Worth to McAllen on or about December 20, 1992, to personally meet with Respondent, who was unavailable. Respondent thereafter failed to communicate with Sanchez or respond to his calls and visits. In addition, Respondent failed to refund Sanchez' unearned retainer fee or return Francisca Sanchez' file.

VI.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs III., IV. and V. hereinabove which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rules 1.01(b)(1), 1.01(b)(2), 1.03(a), 1.15(d) and/or 8.04(a)(3) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

VII.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Avelino Sanchez filing a complaint on or about December 20, 1993.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
