Dear Attorney:

The Supreme Court of Texas requires all members wishing to voluntarily resign from the State Bar of Texas to surrender all Bar cards, all Law Licenses, all certificates issued to you by the Supreme Court, and submit a **sworn** affidavit stating:

"I (the resigning member) have surrendered all Bar Cards, all Law Licenses, and all certificates issued to me by the Supreme Court of Texas."

This requirement is in addition to the **notarized** affidavit to be submitted by the resigning member pursuant to Article III, Section 6(A) of the State Bar Rules stating that the purpose in resigning is not to avoid disciplinary action and that there is no knowledge of any unresolved allegations of professional misconduct.

Please be advised that until such time as you comply with the requirements set forth herein you will continue to be shown on the membership rolls as an active member who must comply with the payment of Bar dues and the performance of continuing legal education mandated by the State Bar Act. This means that you would be subject to administrative suspension for any subsequent failure to pay Bar dues and/or failure to perform minimum continuing legal education.

If you are currently on the inactive rolls, you do not have to comply with the continuing legal education requirements; however, you are required to pay \$50 annually to remain in good standing.

Please send the affidavits, cards, licenses, and certificates to my attention at the address listed below. I will forward them to the Supreme Court with the other necessary documents.

Subchapter H, Sec. 191.1441(a) of the Tax Code enacted by the Texas State Legislature provides as follows:

“The Supreme Court shall suspend from the practice of law a person who does not pay, within 90 days after the date it is due, the tax imposed by this subchapter or a penalty relating to that tax.”

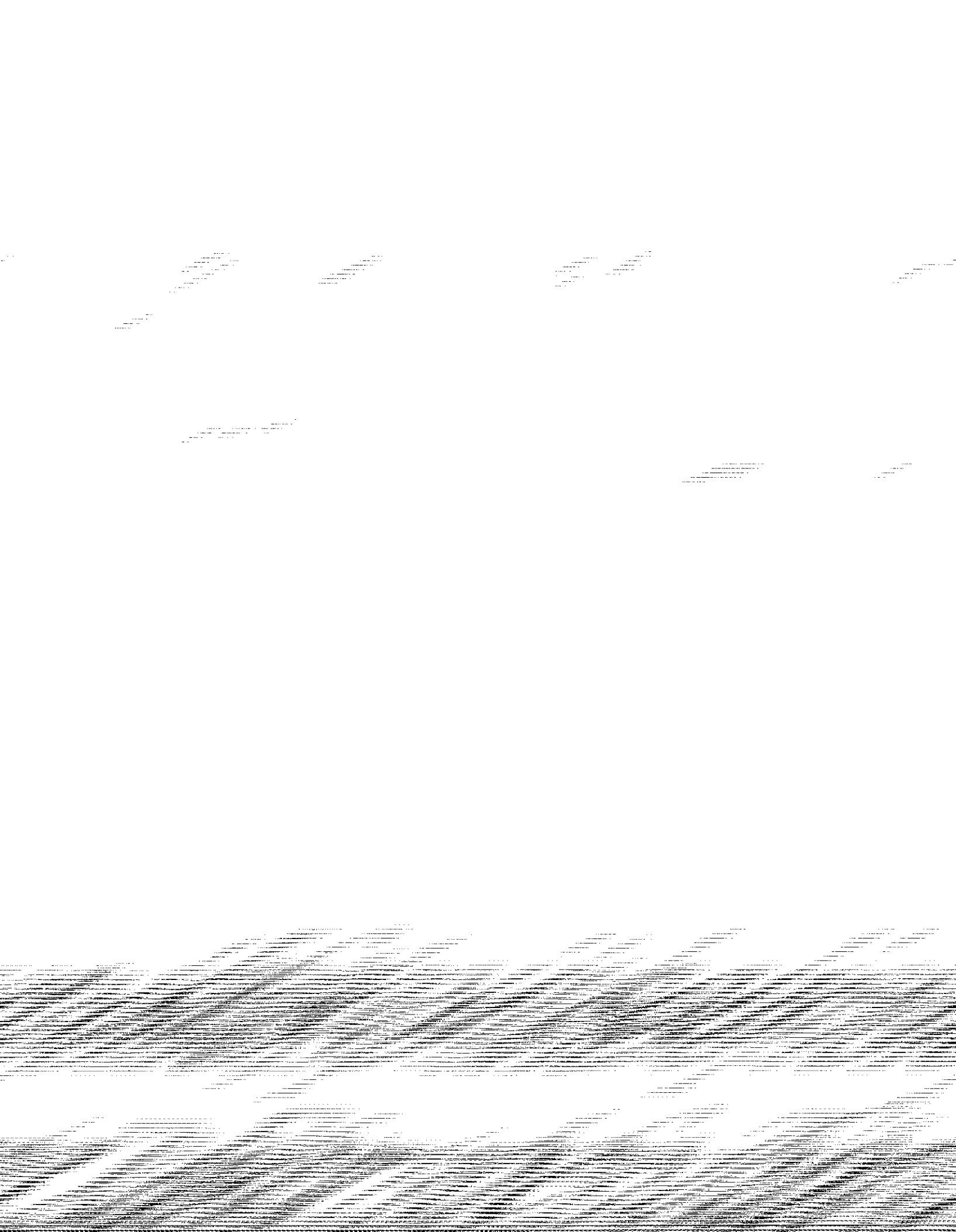
Pursuant to the above, Sec. 191.1441(b) of the Tax Code provides:

“An attorney who is suspended under Subsection (a) shall be reinstated on payment of the tax and any interest and penalties.”

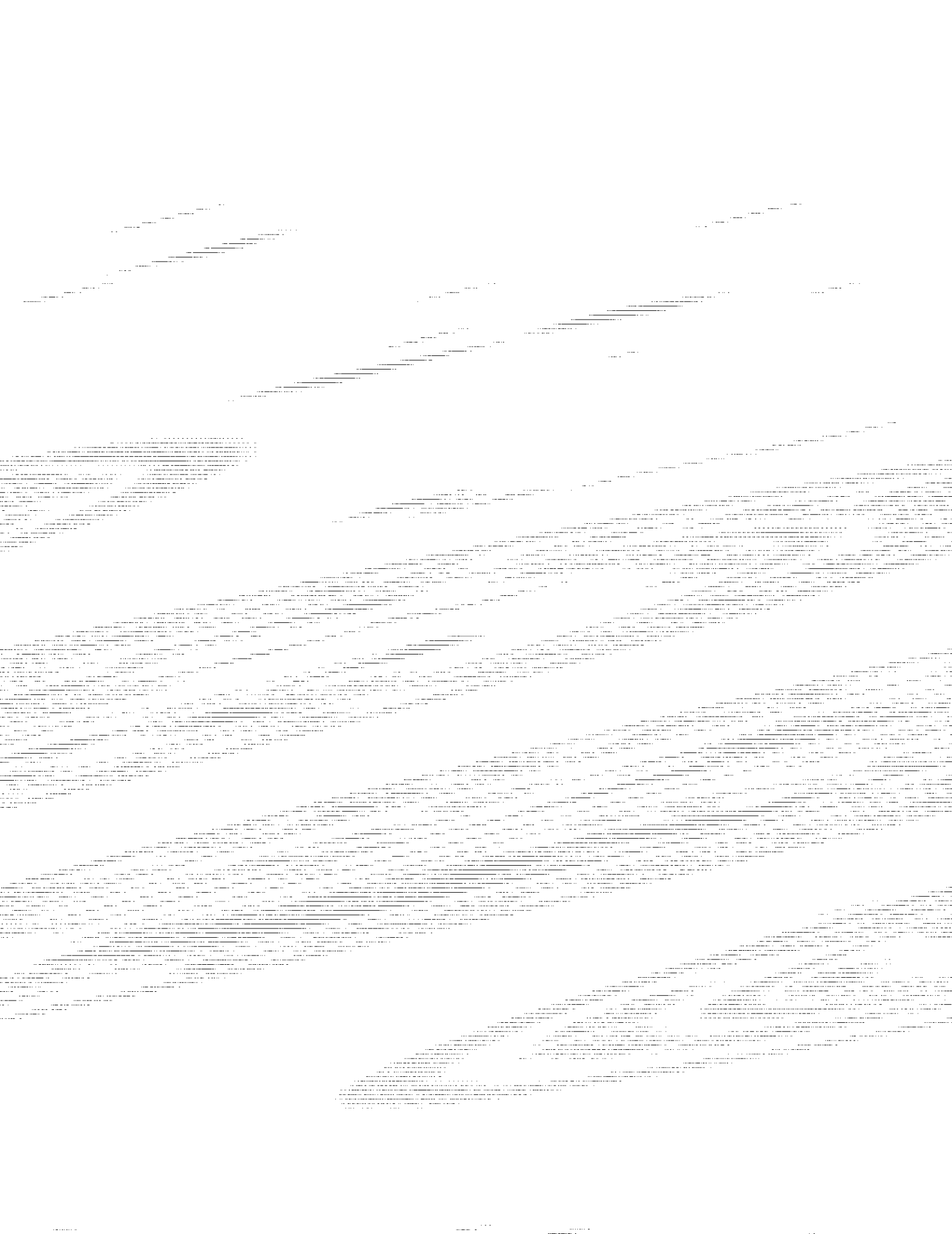

1. My name is David Joseph Saacks and I currently reside at [REDACTED], [REDACTED].
2. On May 4, 1990 I was licensed to practice law in the State of Texas. My State Bar number is 17498740.
3. I practiced law in Texas until June, 1991, at which time my wife and I moved to North Carolina to further her medical training. I have subsequently been licensed to practice law in the State of North Carolina and have been doing so since June, 1992.
4. At the time of our relocation in June, 1991, I was placed on the inactive roll of the State Bar of Texas.
