TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, Marilynn S. Mayse, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, <u>et seq.</u> (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has her principal place of practice in Dallas County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at 2710 N. Stemmons Freeway, Tower North, Suite 900, Dallas, Texas 75207.

III.

In or about October or November, 1995, Complainant employed Respondent to represent her

Subsequently, Respondent filed a divorce petition and a prove-up hearing was conducted on or about January 15, 1997, but a final decree was not submitted to the Judge. Thereafter, Complainant repeatedly attempted to communicate with Respondent regarding her case, but Respondent was never available. Complainant repeatedly left telephone messages for Respondent to provide her with information regarding her case, but Respondent failed to return her calls. Respondent failed to submit to the Court the Final Decree of Divorce until January 6, 1998, approximately one (1) year after the prove-up hearing and approximately two months after receiving notice of the grievance filed against her by Complainant.

IV.

On or about October 27, 1997, the State Bar of Texas sent, by certified mail return receipt requested, a letter to Respondent notifying her that a complaint alleging professional misconduct on her part had been filed against her. In said letter, Respondent was advised that, pursuant to Rule 2.09 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, she was required to file a written response with the State Bar of Texas within thirty (30) days of her receipt of the letter. Respondent received the letter on October 28, 1997, and failed to furnish the State Bar of Texas a written response to the complaint within the thirty (30) days of her receipt of the notification letter, and she failed to timely assert a privilege or other legal ground for her failure to furnish her response.

V.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs III, IV and V, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rules 1.01(b)(1), 1.03(a) and 8.04(a)(8) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
