Please will someone help me resign in the appropriate fashion?!

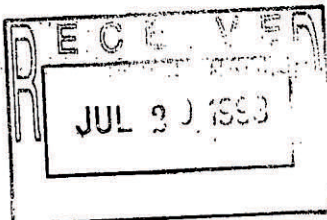
All my prior contacts with the State Bar have been good ones; let's also have a good mutual good-bye.

In anticipation of somebody lending me assistance, I thank you.

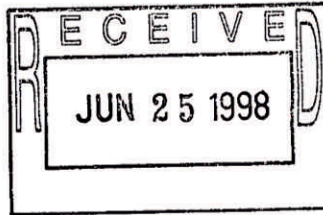
