ORIGINAL DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT:

COMES NOW, Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the STATE BAR OF TEXAS (hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, ADJUA AYOLUWA UMOJA (hereinafter referred to as "Respondent"), and would respectfully show unto the Court the following:

I. <u>DISCOVERY CONTROL PLAN</u>

Pursuant to Rules 190.1 and 190.2, TEXAS RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE (TRCP), Petitioner intends discovery in this case to be conducted under the Level 1 Discovery Control Plan. Pursuant to Rule 190.2(a)(1), TRCP, Petitioner affirmatively pleads that it seeks only monetary relief aggregating fifty thousand and no/100 dollars (\$50,000.00) or less, excluding costs, pre-judgment interest and attorney's fees.

II. NATURE OF PROCEEDING

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the STATE BAR ACT, TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE ANNOTATED §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994); the TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULES OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT; and the TEXAS RULES OF DISCIPLINARY

PROCEDURE. The complaint that forms the basis of this *Original Disciplinary Petition* was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

III. VENUE

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the STATE BAR OF TEXAS. Respondent's residence and principal place of practice is Harris County, Texas, therefore, venue is appropriate in Harris County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the TEXAS RULES OF DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE. Respondent may be served at her business address, 6620 Harwin, Suite 270, Houston, Texas 77036.

IV. CAUSE OF ACTION

On or about April 30, 1998, ERIC J. SLAUGHTER (hereinafter referred to as "SLAUGHTER") hired Respondent to file a Motion to Modify and paid a retainer fee in the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). During the course of the representation, SLAUGHTER paid Respondent a total of Three Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$350.00). Initially, Respondent proposed to have the motion finalized on May 7, 1998. The Respondent failed to keep this commitment due to an out of town emergency.

Respondent agreed to meet with SLAUGHTER the weekend of May 23, 1998. When he arrived at her office, there was no one there. On May 26, 1998, SLAUGHTER called Respondent's office. Unable to speak to anyone in the office, SLAUGHTER faxed a letter explaining his dissatisfaction of her representation and requested a refund. SLAUGHTER requested a return call as an acknowledgment of the facsimile. Respondent failed to act on his request. SLAUGHTER

called Respondent's office and was told by Respondent that she had received his fax and her assistant was at the courthouse with the file.

On or about June 9, 1998, SLAUGHTER requested the status of a court date. The Respondent informed SLAUGHTER that the court date had been set on June 12, 1998 between 8:00 to 8:15 am.

On June 12, 1998, SLAUGHTER arrived at the courthouse by 8:00 a.m.. Respondent failed to appear at the hearing. SLAUGHTER called Respondent's office and was informed the Respondent had another out of town emergency.

On or about June 22, 1998, the Respondent informed Slaughter that the new court date was June 29, 1998 at 8:30 am. On June 29th, the Respondent failed to appear in court. The Respondent then informed SLAUGHTER the hearing had been re-scheduled to July 2, 1998.

SLAUGHTER made weekly attempts to speak to the Respondent, left messages, but never received a response.

On July 2, 1998, SLAUGHTER filed a complaint with the State Bar of Texas against Respondent.

On or about July 11, 1998, Respondent received notice of the SLAUGHTER complaint. The notice required Respondent to file a written response to the allegations of professional misconduct within thirty (30) days of her receipt of said notice. Respondent wholly failed to provide a written response. On or about September 24, 1997, Respondent also received a subpoena, which commanded her to provide a complete copy of SLAUGHTER'S client file to the Grievance Committee on or before October 7, 1998. Respondent failed to timely comply with the subpoena.

V. RULE VIOLATIONS

The acts and/or omissions of Respondent described in Paragraph IV above, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct in violation of Rules 1.01(b) [for neglecting a legal matter entrusted to the lawyer]; 1.03(a) [for failing to keep a client reasonably informed about the status of a matter and promptly comply with reasonable requests for information], 8.01(b) [for knowingly failing to respond to a lawful demand for information from a disciplinary authority]; and 8.04(a)(8) [a lawyer shall not fail to timely furnish to the Chief Disciplinary Counsel's office or a district grievance committee a response or other information as required by the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure].

VIII.

The complaint that forms the basis of this cause of action was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the STATE BAR OF TEXAS by ERIC SLAUGHTER' S filing of a complaint on or about July 2, 1998.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent, ADJUA AYOLUWA UMOJA, by reprimand, suspension, or disbarment, as the facts shall warrant; order restitution to Complainant; and grant all other relief to which Petitioner may show itself to be justly entitled, including costs of court and attorneys' fees.

Touche Ross Co., 946 S.W.2d 862 (Tex. App. - Houston [14th Dist.] 1997), which requires that all proceedings incident to a case occur in the county of proper venue. If not, I would respectfully request that an alternate appointment be made.

Once a trial judge has been appointed, please forward the original and two (2) copies of the Disciplinary Petition, the filing fee check, also enclosed herewith, and the Court's appointing
