## **Key Take-Aways**

- State-level leadership is important
- The role and needs of the courts should be acknowledged by state and local first responders
- Designation of authority and succession matters
- Legal issues and "mission critical" functions must be considered
- Resource constraints are real but need not be a barrier to planning
- Key plan elements
  - Interagency coordination
  - Communication protocols (internal and external)
  - Record preservation and rehabilitation
  - Evidence preservation
  - Problem-solving court issues
  - Human resource issues
  - Plan training and testing
