Report from the Texas Indigent Defense Commission (TIDC) for the April 9, 2021 Texas Judicial Council Meeting

TIDC Board and Committee Meetings

The TIDC Full Board met on Thursday, December 3, 2020, to discuss Indigent Defense Plan and Indigent Defense Expenditure Report (IDER)

submissions, grant programs, and reports from the Improvement and Policy teams. The TIDC Full Board met on March 4, 2021 for updates from the TIDC Funding, Improvement, Oversight and The next Commission teams. meeting will be held on Thursday, June 17, 2021.

TIDC at the Texas Legislature

TIDC filed its Legislative Appropriations Request (LAR); TIDC Executive Director Geoff Burkhart testified at a joint budget hearing before the Governor's Office, Legislative Budget Board, Senate Finance, and House Appropriations staff; and TIDC submitted <u>written</u> <u>testimony regarding Interim Charge 3</u>, which concerns public defense, to the House Criminal Jurisprudence Committee.





Presiding Judge Keller testified on TIDC's behalf at the <u>Senate Finance Committee</u> <u>hearing</u> (February 11), Wesley Shackelford testified virtually at the <u>House Criminal</u> <u>Jurisprudence Committee meeting</u> (March 1), Presiding Judge Keller testified at the <u>House</u> <u>Appropriations – Subcommittee on Art I, IV, &</u> \underline{V} (March 3), Scott Ehlers testified at the <u>House Criminal Jurisprudence Committee</u> <u>meeting</u> (March 8), and Geoff Burkart testified

on HB 2864 (Chair Nicole Collier) and HB 2446 (Representative Canales) at the <u>House</u> <u>Criminal Jurisprudence Committee hearing</u> (March 29).

TIDC COVID-19 Update

TIDC staff are working from home. About 90% of our core operations are continuing remotely. Here's a summary of our activities:

TIDC staff attended a presentation on COVID-19 research with UT Professor Deitch in November.

Staff Update

In addition to its normal monitoring, grants administration, and data collection, TIDC staff has been involved in the following:

- TIDC released its <u>Public Defender Primer</u> in the fall. The Primer collects research on public defender programs, explores Texas public defender offices, and shows how counties can build a public defender office in their jurisdiction.
- TIDC released the <u>Starr County Regional Public Defender Grant Evaluation report</u>. TIDC found that the TRLA Starr County Regional Public Defender Office improved indigent defense in Starr, Duval, and Jim Hogg Counties, while keeping costs low.
