# Report from the Texas Indigent Defense Commission (TIDC) for the August 20, 2021 Texas Judicial Council Meeting

### TIDC Board and Committee Meetings

The TIDC Full Board met on Thursday, March 4, for updates from the Funding, Improvement, and Oversight teams. The Grants and Reporting

Committee met on Friday, June 11 to discuss Improvement Grant requests for FY22. The Full Board met on Thursday, June 17 to discuss the recent legislative session, Improvement Grant requests, and updates from the Improvement and Oversight teams. The Grants and Review Committee met on August 13 to discuss Improvement Grant requests for FY22, and the Full

Board met on August 19. Late last month, TIDC's Board held an Emergency Meeting to discuss Operation Lone Star. TIDC awarded over \$400,000 in funding to provide legal counsel along the border.



# TIDC at the Texas Legislature

The Legislature restored TIDC's 5% budget cut (~\$4.5 million for the biennium) and added \$500,000 for grants to counties, for a total of \$5 million. The Legislature also passed HB 295, filed by Representative Andy Murr. HB 295 allows TIDC to fund nonprofits that provide indigent defense services in Texas. It also puts public defender offices and private assigned counsel on equal footing when it comes to counties' abilities to raise revenues for indigent defense.





Geoff also testified on HB 3482 at the <u>House Ways and Means Committee meeting</u> (April 19). He testified on SB 1322 at the <u>Senate Criminal Justice Committee meeting</u> (April 20) and on HB295 at the <u>Senate Committee on Jurisprudence</u> meeting (May 20).
