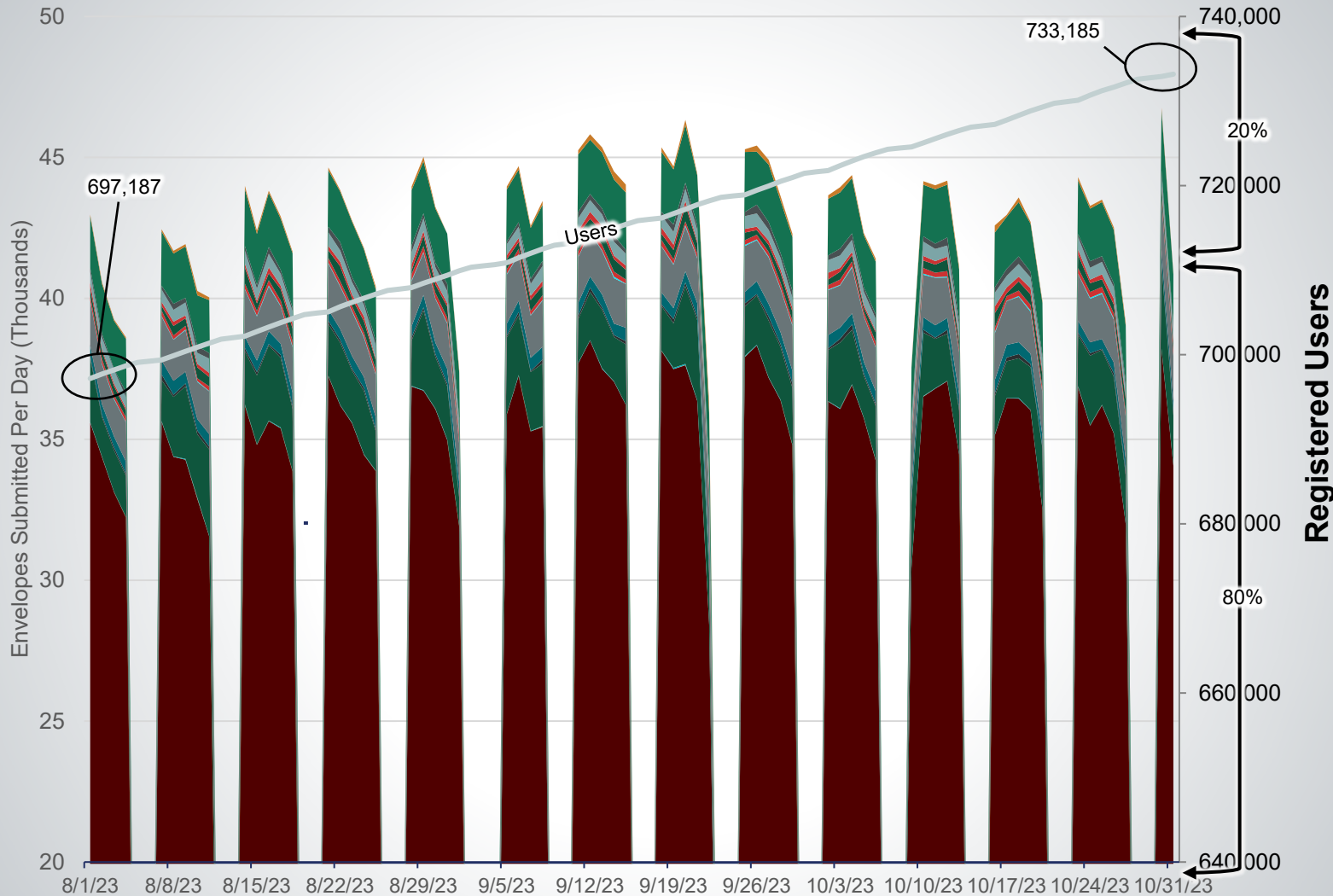

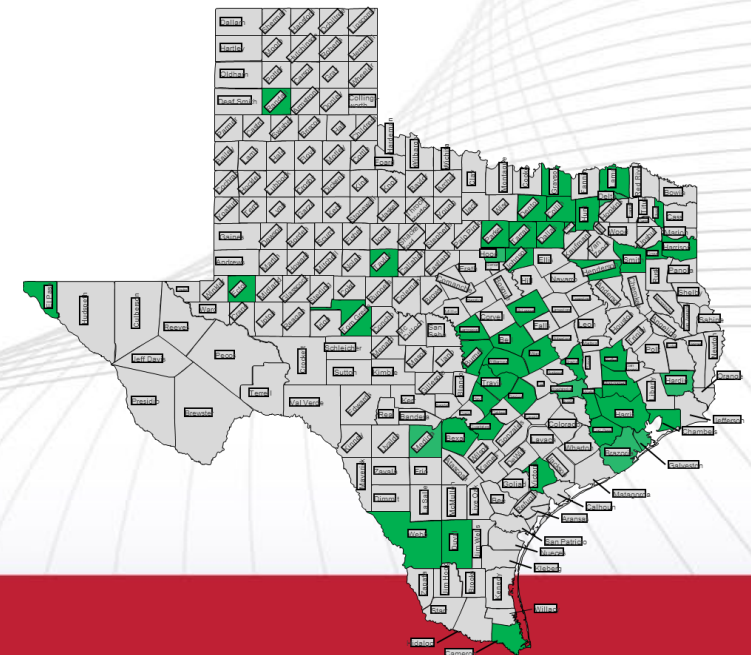


Program Continues to Thrive

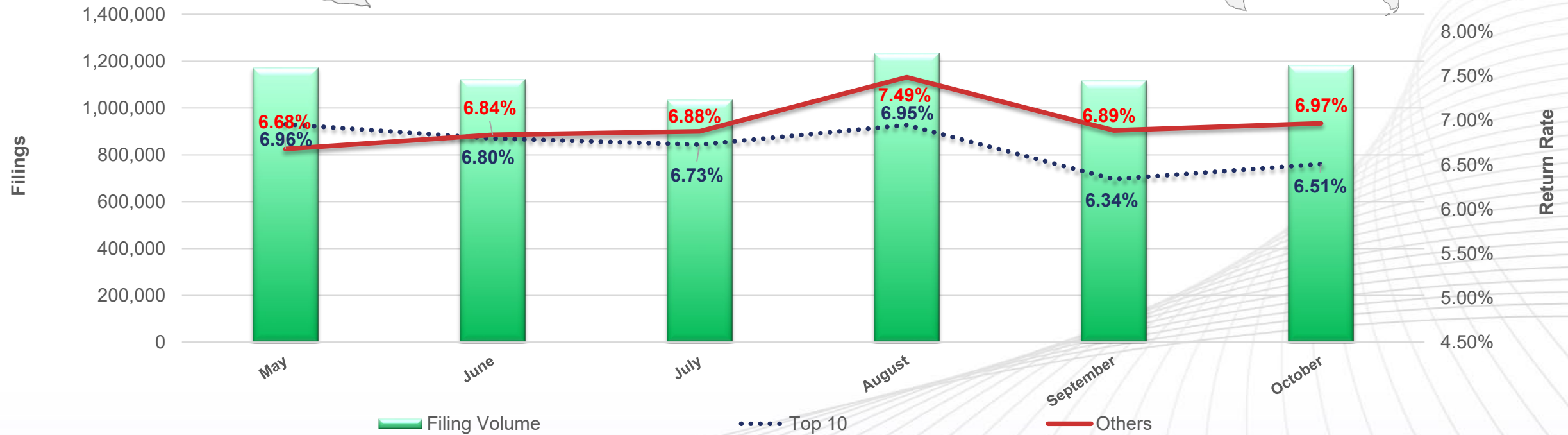
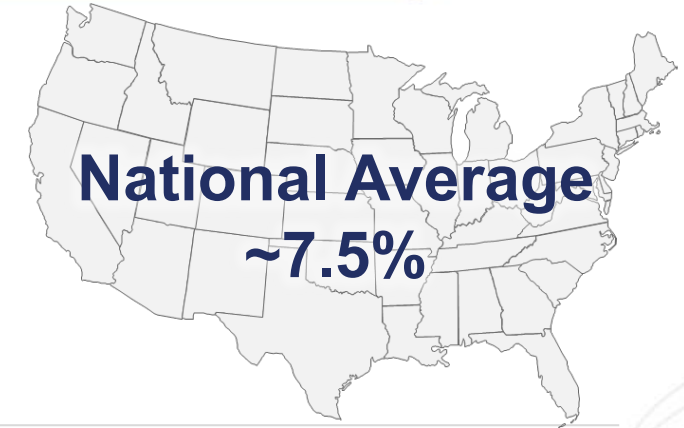
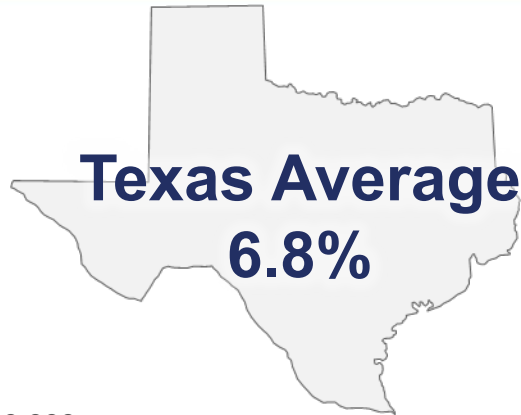
- 733k+ user accounts created to date

JP Update

- 190 precincts across 49 counties live
 - 20 out of "Top 22" counties live with one or more JP precinct
 - Hidalgo JP4.2 GL scheduled for Q4
- 7 active/pending engagements



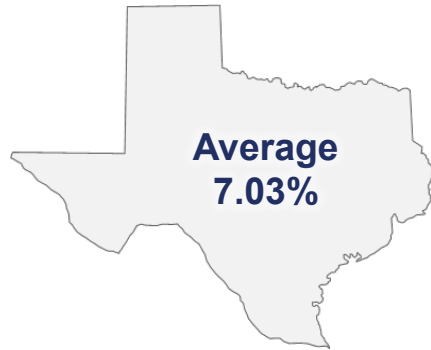
Return for Correction Rates – Market Comparison

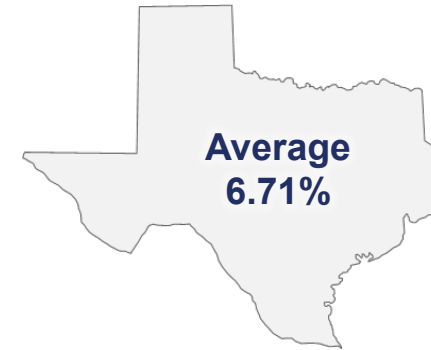

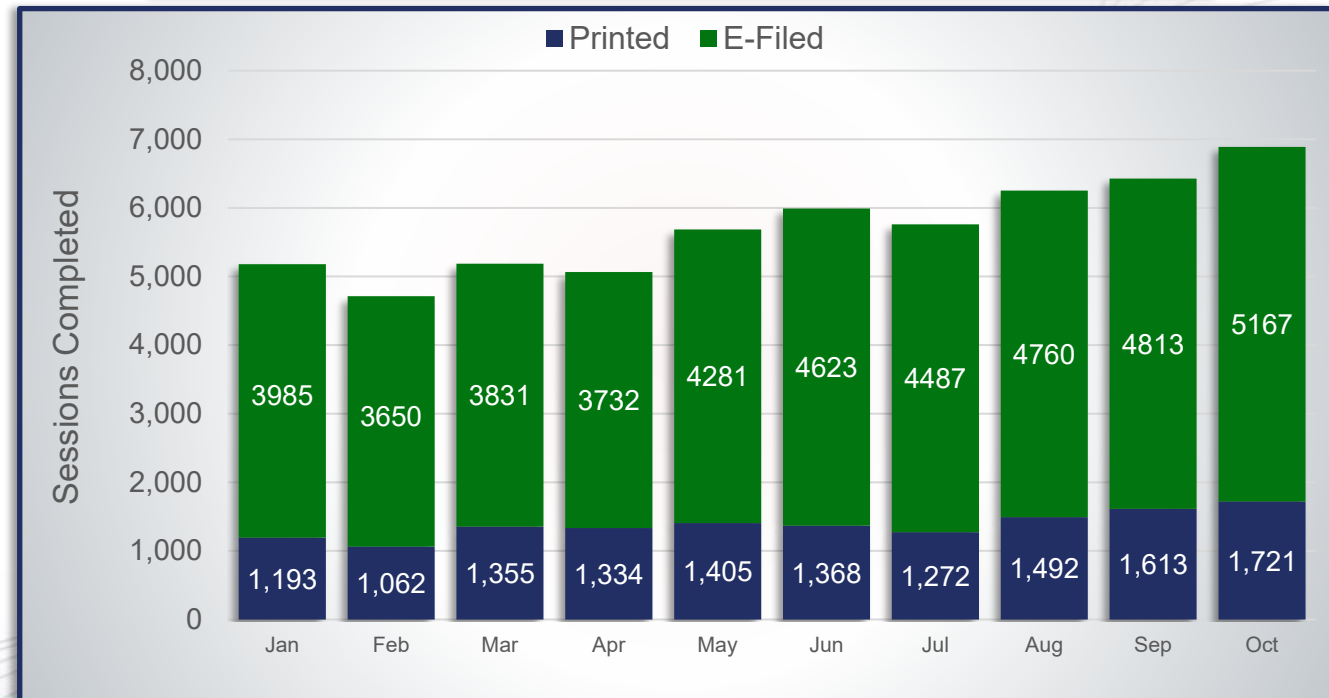
Summary

- **eFileTexas Self Help average completion rate steadily improving YoY:**

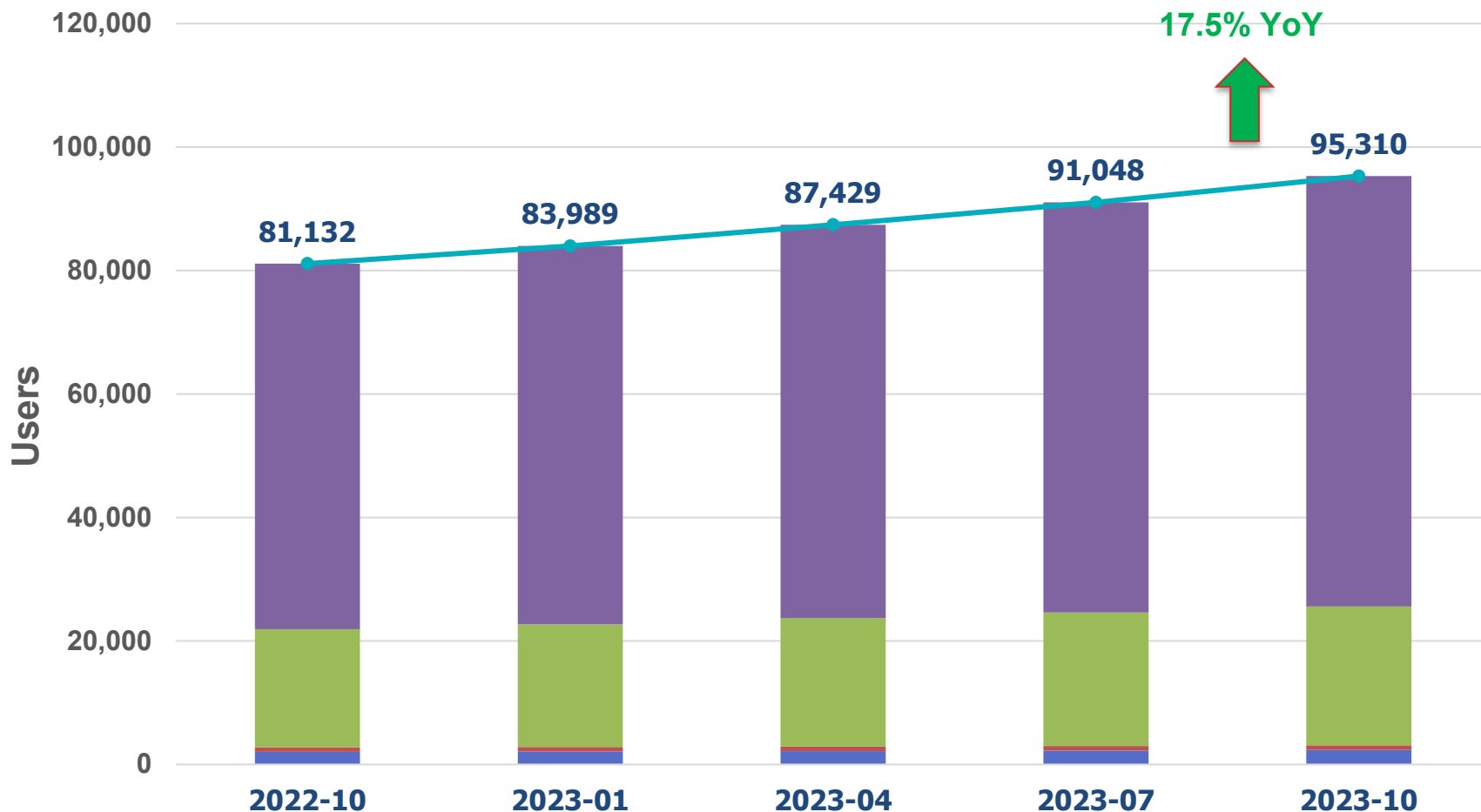

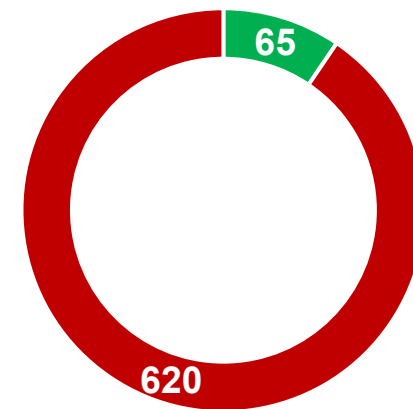

Doc Purchase Revenue (9/2022 – 9/2023)

- Integrated Courts - \$160,089
- Non-Integrated Courts - \$188,427

Texas UCMS project coming to critical decision point regarding the Public Access solution, and where to surface publicly available criminal records

Recommended Solution:

Surface publicly available criminal information in Statewide instance of ReSearchTX

Benefits:

- Single, unified system for public access
- No additional cost burden to clerks
- Low level of effort to stand up criminal data
- Security/Rights/Roles can be adjusted to accommodate criminal

Drawbacks:

- Criminal data is not permitted on ReSearchTX today



Alternative Solutions:

Local county-level instances of ReSearch or Local Portal Instances

Benefits:

- No rule change necessary
- Security/Rights/Roles can be adjusted to accommodate Criminal

Drawbacks:

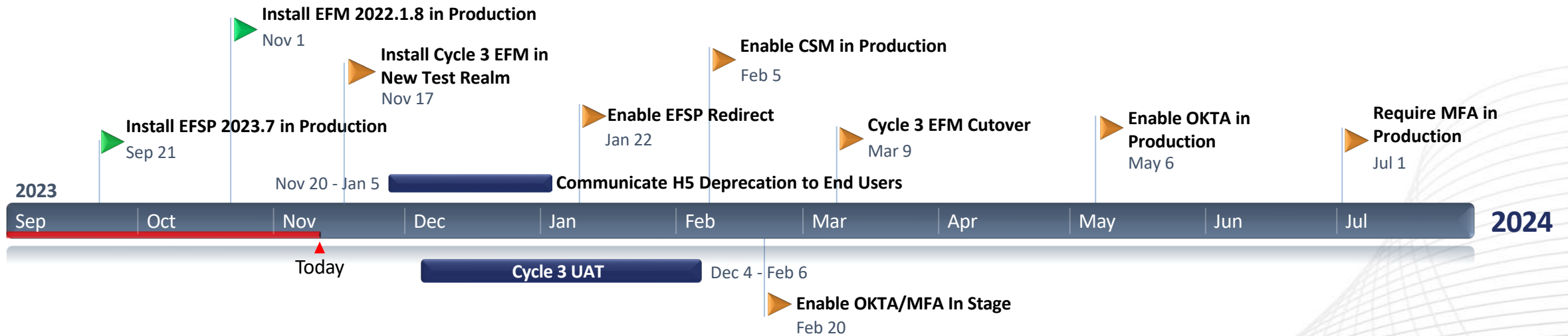
- Clerks must implement and maintain two systems (ReSearchTX and local instance) bearing the expense for the latter
- Attorneys must visit multiple systems for information
- Tyler sunseting local Portal application by 2025

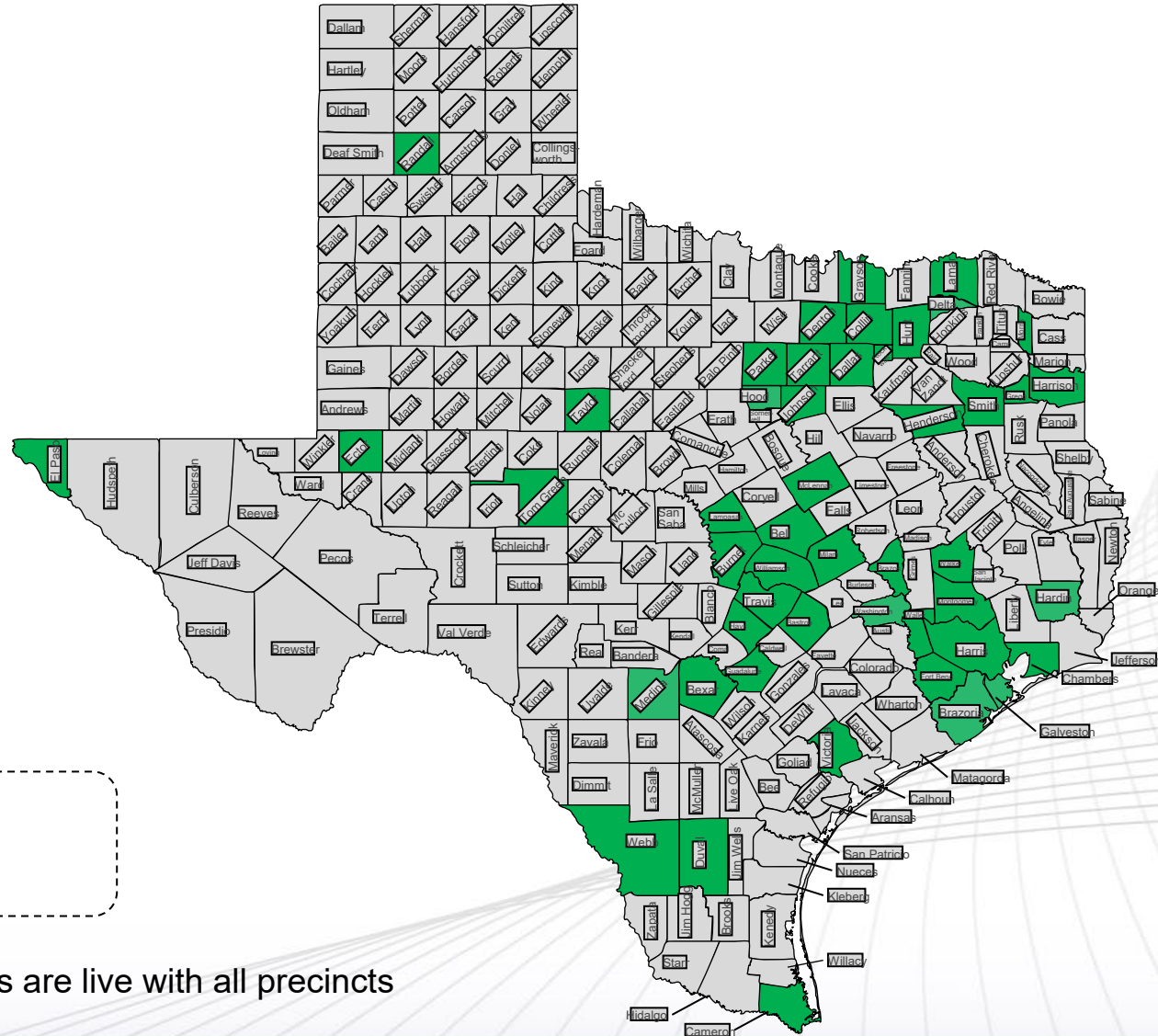

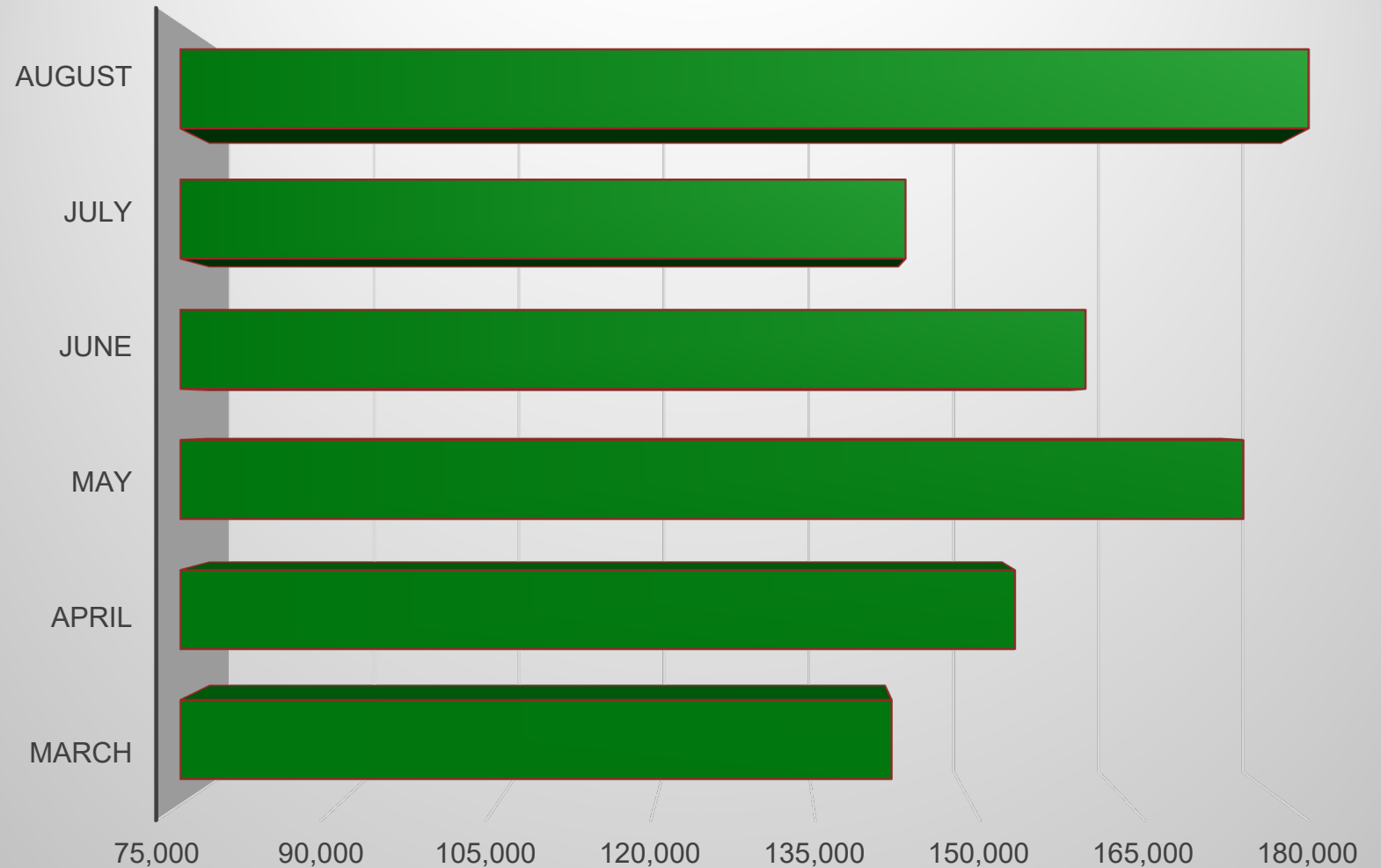

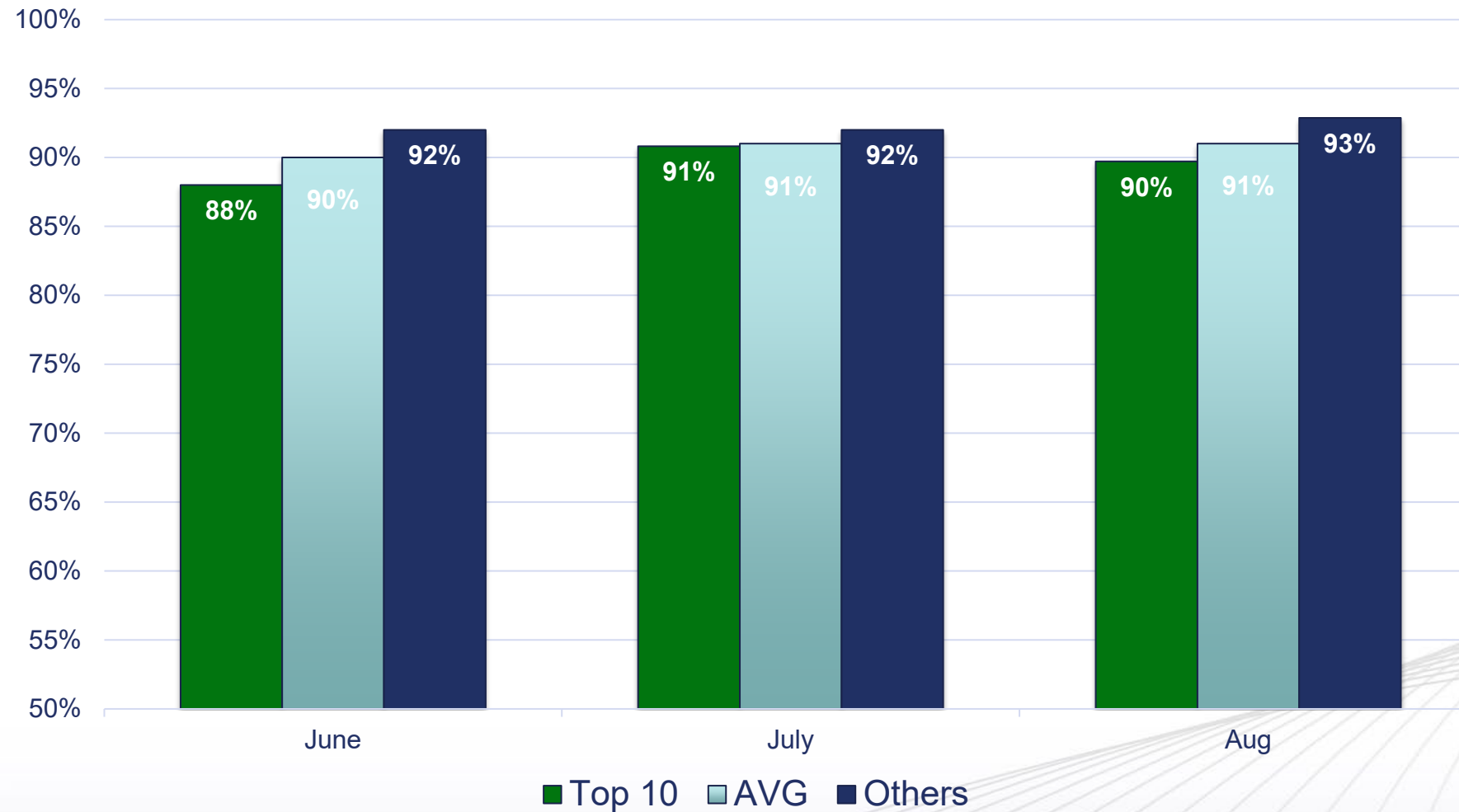

JP Filing Volume

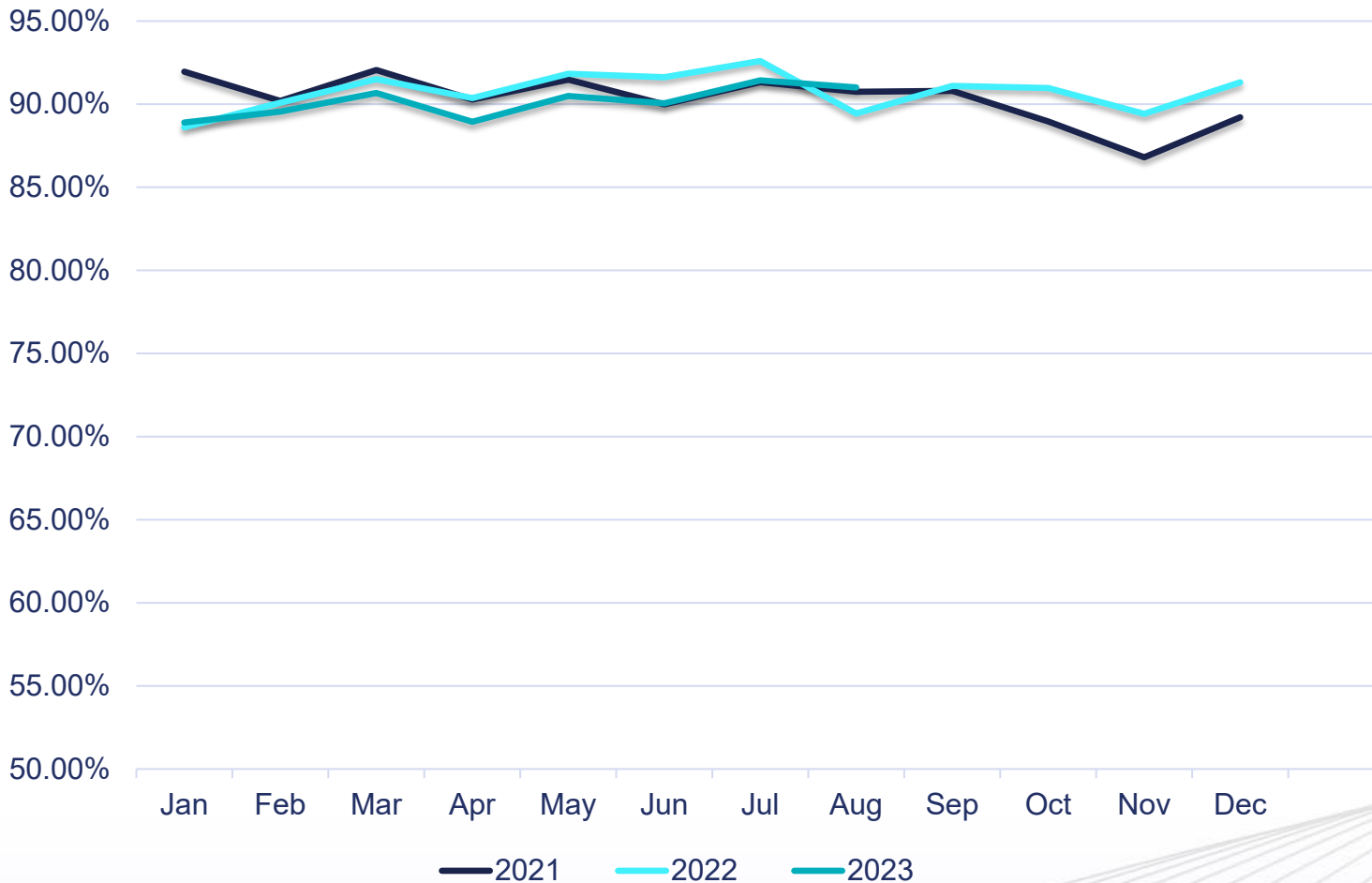


Responses in Under 24 Hours



- Response rates are similar between courts of different sizes
- In 2023, 90% of all filings were accepted/returned for correction within 24 hours of submission

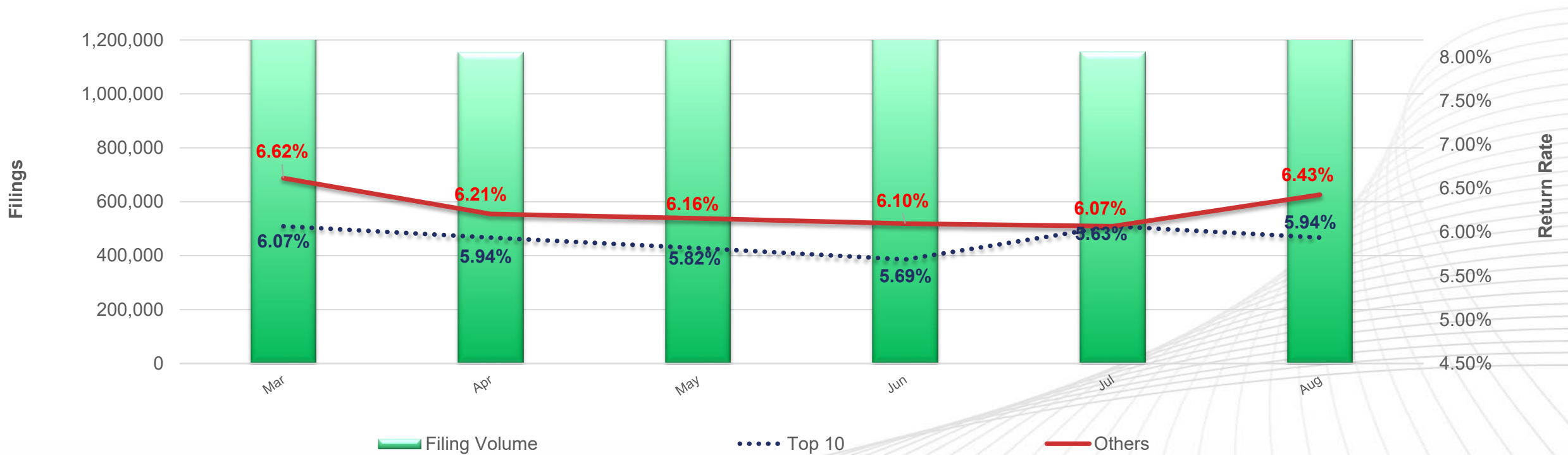
Responses in Under 24 Hours



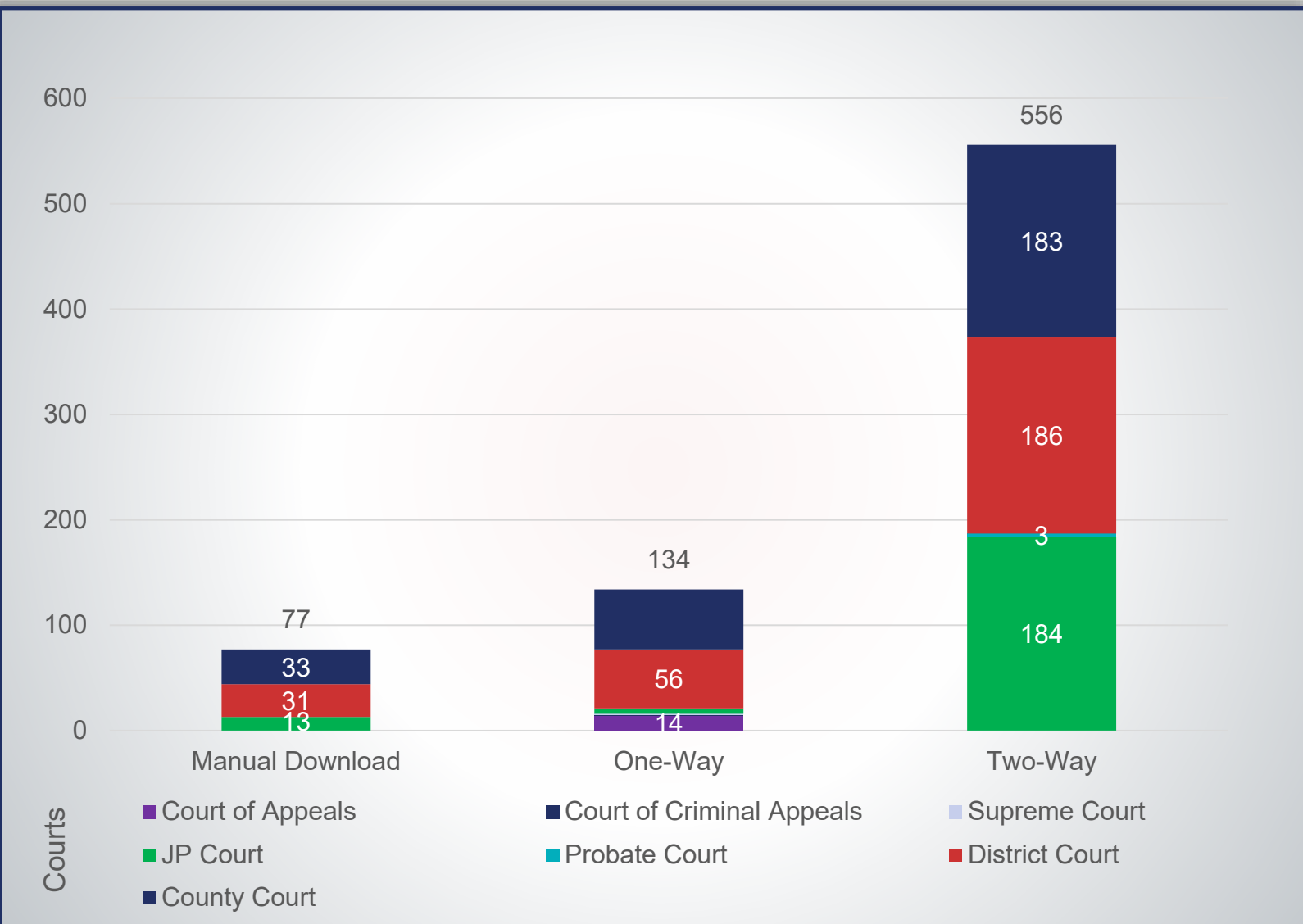
- **Clerks continue to review filings in a timely manner**
- **90.13% of filings are processed in under 24 hours in 2023**
- **Marginal difference** between integrated and non-integrated

Return for Correction Rates – Last 6 Months

- Return for Correction rates average 6% across the state
 - National average is ~8%
- Filers and Clerks alike, are comfortable with the e-filing process



*Tracking of top 10 counties (in population) began in September 2018



- 84% of offices live on eFileTexas are integrated w/ their Case Management Systems (556 out of 673)
- Integration progress being made with CMS vendors:
 - 6 CMS vendors have established One-Way integration
 - 7 CMS vendors have established Two-Way integration
