**ORDER DETERMINING PLAINTIFF, MICHAEL REEVES,
TO BE A VEXATIOUS LITIGANT UNDER CHAPTER 11 OF THE
TEXAS CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE AND SETTING SECURITY**

On this day the Court heard Defendant's Motion for Order Determining Plaintiff a Vexatious Litigant. After consideration of the motion, evidence, and argument of counsel, the Court finds that the motion should be **GRANTED** in all respects.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that Plaintiff, Michael Reeves, is determined by the Court to be a vexatious litigant, as that term is used in Chapter 11 of the Texas Civil Practices and Remedies Code. It is further

ORDERED that on or before December 1st, 2006, Plaintiff shall furnish security in the form of an executed bond in the amount of \$ 500.00, with two or more good and sufficient sureties to be approved by the Clerk, or cash deposit in such amount in lieu therefore, for the benefit of Defendant Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation, to assure payment to Defendant of any reasonable expenses incurred in or in connection with this litigation. It is further

ORDERED that, based upon the finding that Michael Reeves is a vexatious litigant, Michael Reeves is hereby prohibited from filing, *in propria persona*, any new litigation in a court in the State of Texas without first obtaining approval to do so from the local administrative judge of the court in which Michael Reeves seeks to file the litigation.
