Petition to the Supreme Court of Texas

To the Honorable Chief Justice and Justices of the Supreme Court of Texas:

After service as Judge of the 46th District Court from 1959 to 1971, a Commissioner of the Court of Criminal Appeals from 1971-1977 and a Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals from 1978, I retired on December 31, 1986. At that time, I notified the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of my election to be a judicial officer subject to assignment.

Shortly thereafter, I became an Assistant Attorney General and served on the Attorney General's Opinions Committee until December 1990.

Now, pursuant to the provisions of §§ 75.001(b)(2) and (c) of the Texas Government Code, I petition the Supreme Court of Texas to approve my election and reinstatement as a judicial officer subject to assignment.
