

PETITIONER'S ORIGINAL DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Comes now, Petitioner, COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complaining of Respondent, OSCAR L. CANTU, JR., and in support thereof would respectfully show the Court the following:

Parties

Petitioner is the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent, OSCAR L. CANTU, JR., Texas State Bar Number 03767448, is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Bexar County, Texas. Respondent may be served with citation and a copy of this petition by serving him at his principal place of business located at **8610 Broadway, Suite 220, San Antonio, Texas 78217.**

Venue

Respondent's principal place of law practice is in Bexar County, Texas. Accordingly, pursuant to Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure 3.03, venue is proper in Bexar County, Texas.

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann., Sec. 81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of this action was filed by the State Bar of Texas on or about July 28, 1998. The acts and conduct of Respondent, as hereinafter alleged, constitute professional misconduct.

II.

1. On or about September 1, 1995, Respondent's license to practice law in the State of Texas was suspended due to his failure to pay his Bar Dues. Respondent remained on suspension until approximately August 4, 1998, at which time Respondent paid all past-due amounts for Bar Dues and Professional Taxes.

2. During the period of Respondent's suspension, Respondent continued to practice law by filing documents with various courts as attorney and counselor at law for his clients.

3. During the period of Respondent's suspension, Respondent represented these individuals, giving them legal advise, and communicated with them and others, including medical providers, regarding legal matters using letterhead which identified Respondent as an attorney and counselor at law.

4. By his actions, Respondent engaged in the unauthorized practice of law, a criminal offense in the State of Texas, and violated the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

III.

The conduct of Respondent described above constitutes a violation of the following Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct:

Rule 5.05(a) -- A lawyer shall not practice law in a jurisdiction where doing so violates the regulation of the legal profession in that jurisdiction; and

Rule 8.04(a)(11) -- A lawyer shall not engage in the practice of law when the lawyer's right to practice has been suspended or terminated, including but not limited to situations where a lawyer's right to practice has been administratively suspended for failure to timely pay required fees or assessments.

PRAYER


WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays that a judgment of professional misconduct be entered against Respondent imposing an appropriate sanction as the facts shall warrant and that Petitioner have such other and further relief to which it is entitled, including costs of court, restitution, and reasonable attorney fees.

As a practical matter, I would respectfully suggest that you inquire with the judge to be appointed as to: (1) whether he or she will be able to comply with the 180 day deadline by which the case must be set for trial as set forth in Section 3.07 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure; and (2) whether he or she can accommodate compliance with Mellon Service Co., et al v. Touche Ross Co., 946 S.W.2d 862 (Tex.App.- Houston [14th Dist.] 1997), which requires that all proceedings incident to a case occur in the county of proper venue. If not, I would respectfully request that an alternate appointment be made.





Dear Judge Canales:
