

Transaction and User Volume





Summary

- Average user count increase is ~5k per month
- Average increase in filing volume is ~100k per month
- Consistent growth in user count and filing volume contributed to criminal eFiling mandate


*2019 values are as of 12/1/19

Criminal Mandate



The Court of Criminal Appeals chose to mandate e-filing in criminal matters in June 2016

- > Impacts all 254 counties
- > Graduated scheduled roll-out, based on county population



New reporting tool developed to provide clerks and administrators access to useful data from eFileTexas to help better manage their office


- Current reports include "Return for Correction Rates" and "Clerk Review Response Times"
- Reports can be administered by office and permissions granted only to appropriate users
- Additional reports can be added in the future

Redaction Utilization




Summary

- Redaction was launched in January
- Solution has been utilized over 150k times since January
- Average utilization is over 13k per month
- Implemented by 3 EFSPs
 - ▶ eFileTexas
 - > FileTime
 - > ProDoc


Summary

- 9 counties live with CMS integration with re:SearchTX
 - Account for 18.08% of Texas population

 5 counties working to establish the CMS integration

 Account for 10.22% of Texas population



Concerns pertaining to clerk liability are preventing additional counties from establishing the integration

Clerk Concerns about Statute

- (b) A court clerk is not responsible for the management or removal of a document from a state court document database and is not liable for damages resulting from the release of a document in the database if the clerk in good faith performs the duties as clerk as provided by law and the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure.
- (c) If a court clerk in good faith performs the duties as a clerk as provided by law and the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure, the clerk, the county in which the court is located, and the commissioners court of the county in which the court is located are immune from suit and from liability for the release or disclosure of information that is confidential or otherwise prohibited from disclosure by law, rule, or court order and that is accessed from a state court document database.
- (d) A court clerk is not liable for the release of a sealed or confidential document in the clerk's custody unless the clerk acted intentionally, or with malice, reckless disregard, or gross negligence in the release of the document.

Sections (b) and (c) clearly state that the clerks have no liability

However, clerks are concerned with section (d), stating that they are still liable if they were to integrate


Comments for Improvement:
