



Overarching Tech Changes

- Heavier PM load (MIRP), stronger SLAs.
- Move from Tyler datacenter to AWS better admin tools, greater elasticity and resilience.
- Move from ECF 4.01 to ECF 5.0 includes more of the +Texas data directly in ECF.
- Decoupling of State EFSP, EFM, Clerk Review Tool, and APIs to enable quicker enhancements.
- Potential move from Chase Payment Tech to Texas.gov



- Local Configuration Control (Clerks)




