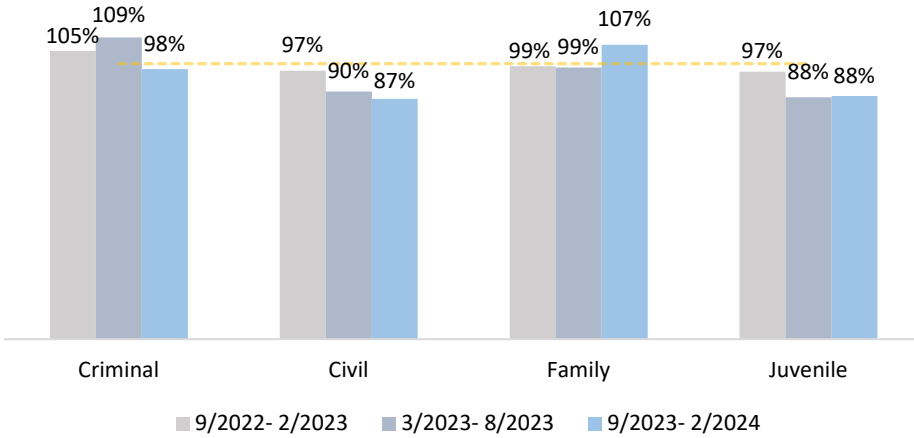




## STATEWIDE CLEARANCE RATES

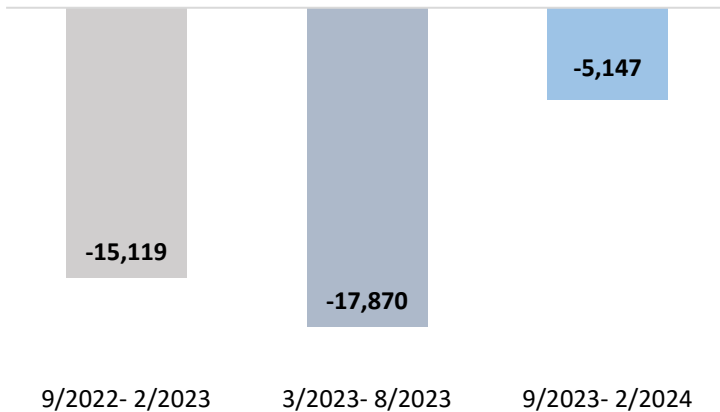
### Statewide District Clearance Rates



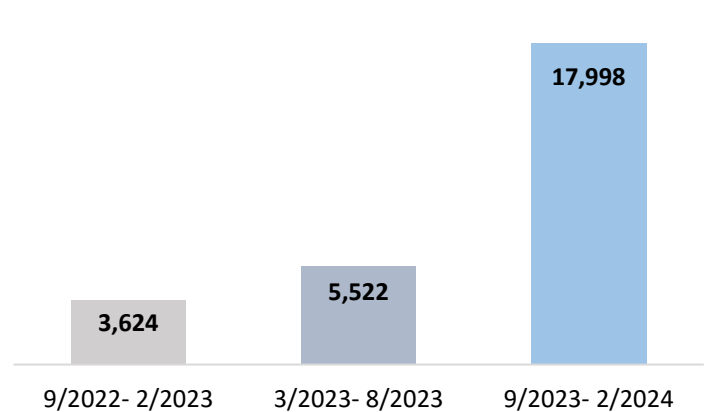
- Family courts experienced the highest clearance rates, reaching 107 percent.
- The largest decrease in clearance rates was in the Criminal courts, which dropped to 98 percent.
- Statewide Civil clearance rates decreased to 87 percent.
- Juvenile clearance rates experienced no change.

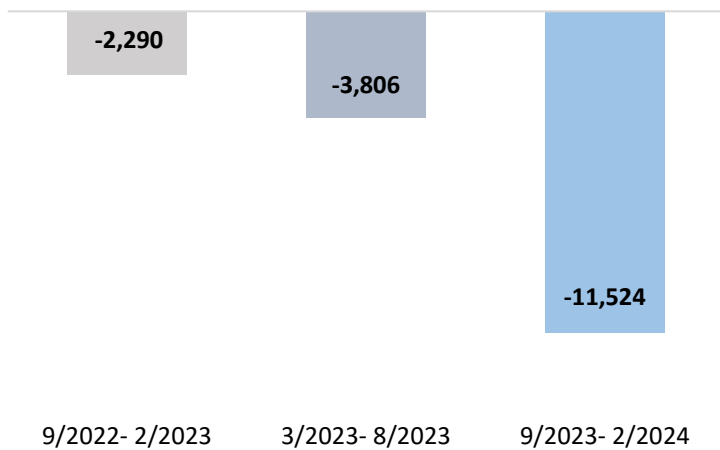
### Criminal Active Pending Cases



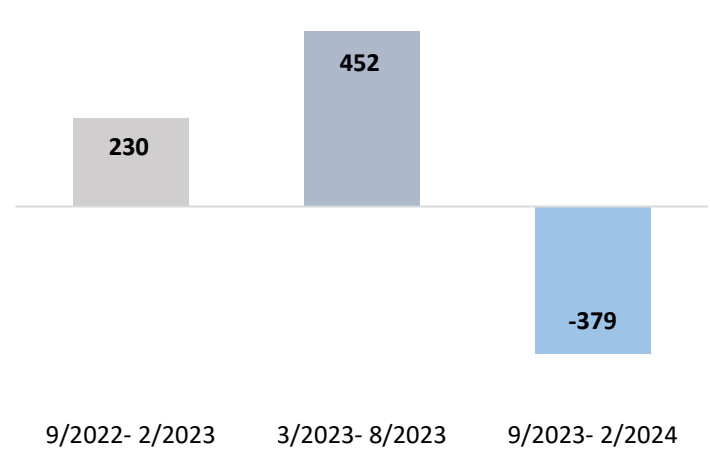

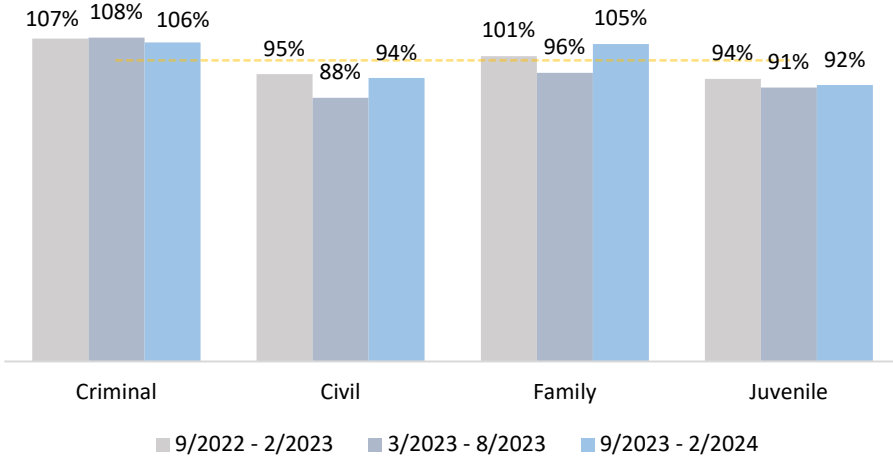

## STATEWIDE CLEARANCE RATES

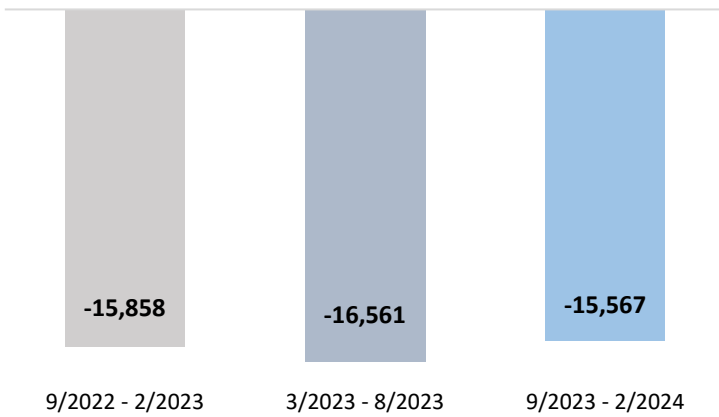
### Statewide County Clearance Rates



- Family courts experienced the highest clearance rates, reaching 105 percent.
- The only decrease in clearance rates was in the Criminal courts (-2%), however courts were still clearing well over 100 percent statewide.
- Civil courts increased clearance rates by 6 percent.
- Juvenile courts increased clearance rates by 1 percent.

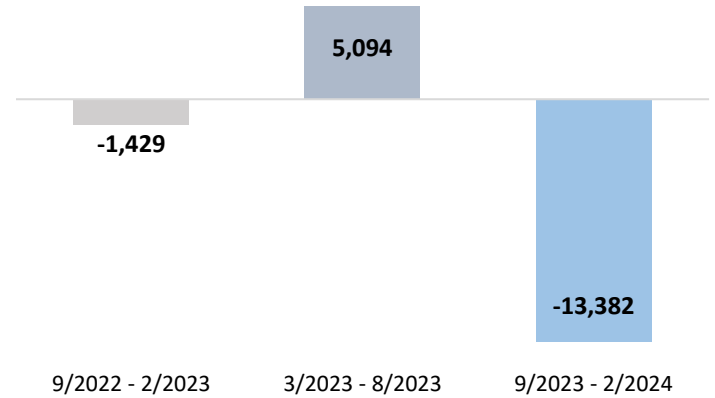

### Criminal Active Pending Cases



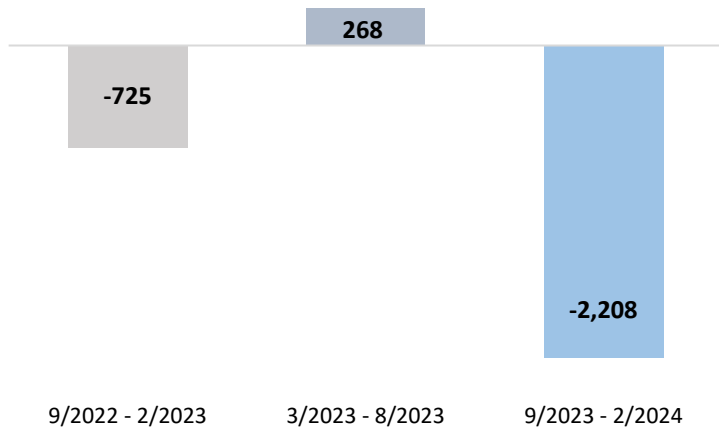

### Civil Active Pending Cases



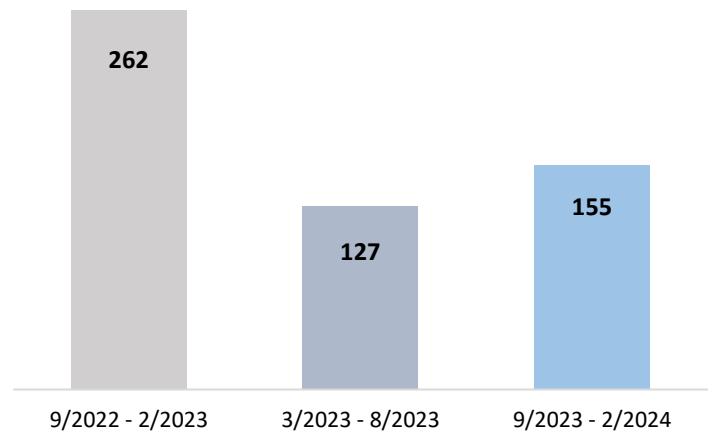
